

Celebrating fifteen years in ministry, International Women's Ministries once again reported record-breaking donations of nearly \$90,000, a 30% increase over the previous year. We praise God for His provision, and we thank our donors!

IWM was able to support our missionary partners around the world; a pastor's home was restored after a fire in the Philippines; women in church leadership were given training and equipping in Nicaragua; missionaries in Peru were given support for their program that teaches women web design; widows were given provision; and we traveled to many of these countries to witness the ministries first-hand and to wipe the tears of our sisters.
